Condition	Signs & Symptoms	Treatment	Definition/Notes
Asthma	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shortness of breath • Wheezing • Chest tightness • Cough 		
Pulmonary Edema			
Pneumonia		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oxygenation • CPAP • Suction if needed. • BVM if inadequate resp. 	
Spontaneous Pneumothorax			
Tension Pneumothorax			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Significant air accumulation in the chest, collapsing the lung, and pushing the mediastinum into the opposite plural cavity decreasing cardiac output.
Pulmonary Embolism			
Epiglottitis			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Typically limited to children • Do NOT inspect the throat due to potentially causing swelling. • Emergent transport and advise facility of findings

Cystic Fibrosis		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Consider the need for suction.• High flow O2• BVM if inadequate respirations are present
